Haussmann Renovation of Paris

Georges-Eugène Haussmann was appointed as Prefect of the Seine between 1853 and 1870 the Emperor Napoleon III It included

- demolition of medieval neighborhoods that were deemed overcrowded and unhealthy by officials at the time;
- the building of wide avenues; new parks and squares; the annexation of the suburbs surrounding Paris;
- and the construction of new sewers, fountains and aqueducts.


Haussmann's work was met with fierce opposition, and he was finally dismissed by Napoleon III in 1870; but work on his projects continued until 1927.









Before adopting Impressionism, they called themselves the **Anonymous Society of Painters, Sculptors, and Printmakers** and their first show opened at about the same time as the annual Salon in **May 1874**.

The term Impressionist was first used by the art critic **Louis Leroy** in his review of the 1874 group.

Their ideas were inspired by Eugene Chevreul's scientific research into color theory.

The Impressionists held eight exhibitions from 1874 through 1886.

To arrest a particular moment in time by pinpointing specific atmospheric conditions light flickering on water, moving clouds, a burst of rain.

Their technique is reconstituted to capture what they saw; Optical blend of colours

The themes are mundane, no intellectual or historical implication

Capturing the momentary fleeting effect of light on the objects.

The First Impressionist Exhibition, 1874. The exhibition opened <u>in Paris on April 15, 1874</u>. It was held on the top floor and former studio of the photographer, Gaspard-Félix Tournachon, better known as Nadar.











During the summer of 1869, Monet and Renoir set up their easels at La Grenouillère, a boating and bathing resort on the Seine River, not far from Paris.






















